I have received reports that Portsmouth has survived Hurricane Erin with little damage, however, I am still awaiting the final report on Evergreen Inlet. If everything continues at the current pace, the cabin containers are slated to be finished by late September with Park Services taking over the cabins in October. This should make them available by late October.

The Billy Safrit Memorial tournament is October 10th-12th beginning at 6am on Friday through noon on Sunday. All fish must be at the weigh-in at the shade shelter by noon October 12th. Please register at least a week prior to the tournament so that the tournament committee members can also enjoy fishing without having to manage late entries. Please be mindful of the rules for the club parking lot and clean up upon departure. As a reminder, no open fires are allowed and no long-term parking is permitted. We will be making improvements on the lot soon and it is important to adhere to the rules to accommodate the work to be done.





Honoring an outstanding Superintendent

CARTERET COUNTY — Retiring Cape Lookout National Seashore Superintendent Jeff West was honored Monday for his years of service in preserving the park's natural and cultural resources.

West was recognized during the July 21 Carteret County Board of Commissioners meeting with a plaque and a resolution outlining his accomplishments.

West, who has worked as the Superintendent of Cape Lookout National Seashore since 2017, was honored for taking part in the significant recovery efforts following Hurricane Florence and collaborating with local organizations to enhance the park's accessibility and community engagement.

The resolution states that West, "has proven this commitment by supervising 36 employees and managing hundreds of volunteers, not to mention overseeing a park that welcomes more than 500,000 visitors annually, generates over \$30 million for our local economy while also preserving the barrier islands, maritime forests and expansive dunes."

West worked 42 years "protecting, preserving, and sharing his knowledge of our public lands through the National Park Service," the resolution notes.

Among his accomplishments, West spearheaded the reconstruction efforts at Cape Lookout after Hurricanes Florence and Dorian caused substantial damage to the harbor at Long Point and to the historic buildings of Portsmouth Village. He was also instrumental in completing the dredging project from Back Sound to Lookout Bight by working with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to make the channel between Harkers Island and Barden's Inlet more navigable for private and commercial users.

The resolution also recognizes that West collaborated with the Crystal Coast Stargazers, the Core Sound Waterfowl Museum, and the Carteret County Chamber of Commerce to secure the designation of Cape Lookout National Seashore as the first national park on the Atlantic Seaboard recognized by the International Dark Sky Association as a Dark Sky Place, "allowing astronomy enthusiasts to marvel at the Milky Way and other cosmic wonders.'

"In 42 years of serving the public I have gotten a lot of awards and this is one of the most important ones I've ever received," West commented. "Carteret County means a lot to me... Even though I'm retiring I'm going to keep my finger on things out there and try to help where I

Board Chairman Chris Chadwick noted that the parks service has had a sometimes contentious relationship with Carteret County's Down East community.

"They came and took the land and made it a national park and there were some hard feelings in the past," he admitted.


Chadwick said although he was skeptical when West first arrived, he soon came to admire him both personally and professionally.

"You never knew when a new superintendent came if you were going to get a good one or a bad one. But when you told me you were from Texas I knew that was a shining star. And then when you were driving a pickup truck instead of a Prius I knew that was an even better sign that you were going to be a good superintendent," Chadwick joked.

Chadwick said West had more than proven himself during times of trouble.

"You've been the man on the tractor after hurricanes, you've been looking out for Portsmouth Island, where my granddaddy was born. You're just a great superintendent and a hands on guy," he told West.




